

CORNISH BUILDINGS GROUP

ANNUAL AWARD SCHEME

Awards are made each year by the Cornish Buildings Group for recently completed or renovated buildings and have become respected and desirable recognitions of achievement. The scheme aims to promote and acknowledge awareness and consideration for good techniques of design and construction.

Rules

1. Buildings must be in Cornwall.
2. Construction, restoration or conversion must have been completed within the two years to that December 31st immediately prior to the closing date for entries.
3. Entries must be accompanied by:

4. Entries may be made by those with no connection to a building or its owners, but the cooperation of the owner, and agreement to the application, would be helpful.
5. The closing date for entries is the last day of March for the award year that ends on the preceding December 31st.
6. The panel of judges will consist of members of the CBG Council.
7. A shortlist will be prepared from submitted applications, and the judges will then visit shortlisted buildings by arrangement with the entrant/owner
8. The decision of the judges' panel is final. No correspondence will be entered into relating to any application or award.
9. Photographs and application material cannot be returned. The applicant accepts that submitted material may be used by the CBG at the award ceremony, may form part of the award display shown at various places, or be used in publicity relating to the award.
10. The judges reserve the right not to make an award if, in their opinion, no entry in any particular category meets the standard in design and workmanship expected by the CBG.
11. Awards are made at an early summer award ceremony with the presentation of Delabole slate plaques and certificates of commendation.
12. Certificates of merit may also be given, perhaps for specific features such as craftsmanship.
